As an option to the dissertation or as a part of it, students may submit an audio or video film, CD or other creative research work with prior consent of the relevant supervisor and the head of the department.

Scheme of Evaluation:

Marks will be given to the completed dissertation or the research work and the students may be asked to face a viva and/or verbal presentation as decided by the department.
